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Therapy Dog Makes Rounds at Glenbeigh

Glenbeigh proudly introduces the use of a therapy dog to enhance treatment for substance use disorders at the Rock Creek inpatient hospital. While pet therapy complements

other therapeutic approaches such as psychotherapy, it offers a unique avenue for individuals to reconnect, improve social skills, and alleviate anxiety and depression.

Grizzly, a certified Therapy Dog, accompanies handler Holly Johnson, PMHNP, during her rounds at Glenbeigh. Johnson, holding a Master of Science in Nursing degree from Walden University and a Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing from Kent State University, is a certified Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner. She is also a

member of the American Holistic Nurses Association and the American Psychiatric Nurses Association.

During weekly medical appointments, Johnson is joined by Grizzly, a 6-year-old Golden Retriever, extensively trained in therapy. Grizzly provides comfort and support to patients, aiding them therapeutically during their appointments with Glenbeigh's medical staff. Patients and staff alike have responded positively, expressing their appreciation for Grizzly's presence.

The benefits of interacting with trained therapy dogs, as outlined by The Alliance of Therapy Dogs, are extensive.



These interactions can lead to physical improvements such as reduced cortisol levels (a stress hormone) and increased release of oxytocin, the body's natural stress-reduction

> chemical. Additionally, something as simple as walking with a therapy dog can contribute to lowered blood pressure.

> Individuals in treatment for substance use disorders often face a heightened risk of relapse when they isolate themselves. Therapy dogs play a pivotal role in empowering socially isolated individuals by fostering emotional growth, enhancing self-image, improving disposition and emotional control and nurturing empathy towards others.

Director of Nursing at Glenbeigh, remarked, "Having a therapy dog at Glenbeigh has brought immense joy to both patients and our caregivers." She praised Grizzly's work at the hospital, emphasizing his role in providing support, affection and comfort wherever he goes. Zalar also praised Johnson for integrating Grizzly into her scheduled weekly medical appointments, noting plans for increased visits throughout 2024 to further benefit patients.

With Grizzly's presence, Glenbeigh continues to foster a healing environment that prioritizes holistic well-being and compassionate care.

Running2BWell Launches May 2024: A New Addition to Support Recovery in Rock Creek

Brian Rosenberg, an inpatient counselor at Rock Creek, played a pivotal role in establishing a collaboration between Glenbeigh and Running2BWell, introducing the program at Rock Creek in May. Keith Johnston, Running2BWell's Executive Director, emphasizes the importance of exercise and constructive activities for sustained recovery and improved mental health. He founded Running2BWell based on research indicating that even low doses of group exercise can benefit those with substance use disorders. This initiative compliments Glenbeigh's programs, which are designed to enhance physical health.



Participants engage in activities like running, walking or jogging, which boost neurotransmitters and foster positive relationships. Johnston, also in recovery, attests to the program's efficacy in sustaining personal recovery. The group focuses on individuals living with substance use disorders and behavioral health issues, assigning mentors—many in recovery—to assist with activities.

Since its founding in 2016, Running2BWell has grown to over 300 participants across 12 locations. Understanding financial constraints, the organization provides donated shoes, apparel, gym memberships, snacks and race entry fees, with shoes being the largest expense. In 2023 alone, they donated 608 pairs of shoes to attendees.

Feedback from staff and participants has been overwhelmingly positive, with many considering Running2BWell activities the highlight of their week. Participants benefit from outdoor exercise, fresh air and socializing, aiming to enhance healthy outcomes.
